TROOP GOALS (2010-2011)

1. An ASPL works with an adult advisor to assist in the planning of each campout.
2. Honor Patrol is required for PL credit OR complete 70% of the requirements to include patrol activities and service projects.
3. Campouts should be themed around skills and requirements.
4. A minimum of 1/3 of the troop attends every campout.
5. Earn the National Camping Award.
6. All leadership earns the Troop Basic Achievement Award or one additional segment.
7. Complete a campout that fulfills THE Historic trails Award.
8. Have troop inter-patrol competition each term.
9. Have 2 troop service projects per term run by the TOAR.
