



TROOP 1128 ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

The Troop 1128 Achievement Award will be recognized by a basic patch plus segments to go around the patch. The BASIC Award must be completed first. The SERVICE Award is required only for MASTER SCOUT Award. The order for the other awards is LEADERSHIP, then OUTDOOR SKILLS, then HIGH ADVENTURE, and finally MASTER SCOUT.

1. BASIC

- a. Be First Class
- b. Earn one Historic Trails Award
- c. Complete Troop Junior Leader Training (JLT)
- d. Perform 20 hours of service work
- e. Earn Outdoor Ethics Awareness Award (see Appendix A)

2. LEADERSHIP

- a. Be Star Scout
- b. Complete Troop Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops (ILST)-1 training
- c. Complete Troop Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops (ILST)-2 training
OR the training for your Patrol leadership position
- d. Serve successfully for 6 months (cumulative) in a leadership position in which you:
 - i. Develop an approved set of goals with a leadership position coach
 - ii. Meet monthly with your coach to evaluate progress
 - iii. Discuss with your coach lessons learned in your position
- e. Working with a skills coach, develop plans to teach at least 2 Scout skills
- f. Using these plans, teach the 2 Scout skills to at least 5 Scouts
- g. Earn Honor Patrol award, either:
 - i. Be Active in a Patrol that earns Honor Patrol award and participate to help your Patrol earn the award (see Appendix B), OR
 - ii. Be SPL/ASPL with at least 3 Patrols earning Honor Patrol award

3. SERVICE

- a. Complete 40 hours of pre-approved service work, including 10 hours of Troop service projects, 10 hours of conservation projects, and 5 hours at Andrew Chapel
- b. Do one of the following:
 - i. Earn World Conservation Award, OR
 - ii. Earn BSA Religious Emblem for your faith and age, OR
 - iii. Complete Troop 1128 God and World Program
- c. Earn First Aid Merit Badge
- d. Earn Citizenship in the Community Merit Badge
- e. Earn Emergency Preparedness or Lifesaving Merit Badge
- f. Sell at least \$250 of Boy Scout popcorn (one time in a single season)

4. OUTDOOR SKILLS

- a. Earn the LEADERSHIP Award
- b. Earn a second Historic Trails Award
- c. Earn Firem'n Chit and Totin' Chip awards
- d. Earn the Paul Bunyan Award
- e. Attend 3 summers of Scout camp
- f. Earn the World Conservation Award
- g. Earn Camping Merit Badge
- h. Earn Cooking Merit Badge
- i. Earn Orienteering Merit Badge
- j. Earn Pioneering Merit Badge
- k. Earn Honor Patrol award a second time (not 2g), either:
 - i. Be Active in a Patrol that earns Honor Patrol award and participate to help your Patrol earn the award (see Appendix B), OR
 - ii. Be SPL/ASPL with at least 3 Patrols earning Honor Patrol award

5. HIGH ADVENTURE (PACKS or PADDLES or both)

- a. Earn the OUTDOOR SKILLS Award
- b. Earn Climbing Merit Badge
- c. Earn Wilderness Survival Merit Badge
- d. Earn the 50-Miler Award

Focusing on either PACKS or PADDLES:

For PACKS Device
<ul style="list-style-type: none">e. Earn either Hiking or Cycling Merit Badgef. Earn Backpacking Merit Badgeg. Working with a coach, plan all aspects of a PACKS high adventure trip of at least 3 days and successfully carry out the planh. Complete a Troop PACKS summer high adventure trip lasting at least 7 days

For PADDLES Device
<ul style="list-style-type: none">e. Earn Swimming Merit Badgef. Earn either Canoeing or Kayaking Merit Badgeg. Earn Whitewater Merit Badgeh. Working with a coach, plan all aspects of a PADDLES high adventure trip of at least 3 days and successfully carry out the plani. Complete a Troop PADDLES summer high adventure trip lasting at least 7 days

6. MASTER SCOUT (PACKS or PADDLES or both)

- a. Earn all of the previous Awards**
- b. Assist in teaching Troop ILST-1 and ILST-2 training**
- c. Serve as leadership position coach for at least 2 Scouts and guide them to successful completion of the LEADERSHIP Award**
- d. Help at least 3 Scouts complete each of Camping, Cooking, Orienteering, and Pioneering Merit Badges**
- e. Help at least 2 Scouts complete both Climbing and Wilderness Survival Merit Badges**

Focusing on either PACKS or PADDLES:

For PACKS Device
f. Help at least 2 Scouts complete either Hiking or Cycling Merit Badge
g. Help at least 2 Scouts complete Backpacking Merit Badge
h. Serve as a coach for at least 2 Scouts in planning and successfully carrying out a 3-day PACKS high adventure trip

For PADDLES Device
f. Help at least 2 Scouts complete Swimming Merit Badge
g. Help at least 2 Scouts complete either Canoeing or Kayaking Merit Badge
h. Help at least 2 Scouts complete Whitewater Merit Badge
i. Serve as a coach for at least 2 Scouts in planning and successfully carrying out a 3-day PADDLES high adventure trip

Appendix A

Outdoor Ethics Awareness Award

Boy Scouts promotes Outdoor Ethics and Leave No Trace through the BSA Outdoor Ethics Awareness Award. The requirements are as follows:

1. Recite from memory and explain the meaning of the Outdoor Code.
2. Watch the National Park Service Leave No Trace video.
3. Complete the Leave No Trace online youth course . Print the certificate.
4. Complete the Tread Lightly! online course. Print the certificate.
5. Participate in an Outdoor Ethics course, workshop, or training activity facilitated by a person who has completed the BSA Outdoor Ethics orientation course or who is a BSA Outdoor Ethics trainer or master educator.

Appendix B

Honor Patrol Award

Honor Patrol award can only be earned with your Patrol. You must be Active in your Patrol when it earns Honor Patrol award, and you must participate with your Patrol at a level sufficient to help it earn the Honor Patrol award, including:

-] Know your Patrol name, emblem and yell
-] Wear your uniform correctly to all Patrol and Scouting events
-] Attend the required number of Patrol meetings set by your Patrol
-] Take part in at least one hike, outdoor activity, or Scouting event with your Patrol
-] Complete at least one Good Turn or service project with your Patrol
-] Other Patrol duties that will help you earn the award are:
 - o Help a Scout in your Patrol advance a rank
 - o Attend a PLC meeting in place of the PL or APL

The Patrol may set other criteria for earning the Honor Patrol award at the beginning of a Term. You need to understand these criteria and achieve them. Your Patrol Leader grants Honor Patrol award to those Scouts in the Patrol who he feels have been active and helped the Patrol earn Honor Patrol that Term. It may be that not all Scouts in a Patrol earn the award when the Patrol earns it.
