To be appointed to this position, a Scout must have earned the rank of First Class, attended a pre-election SPL/PL candidate meeting and at some point completed the Introduction to Leadership course (formerly JLT). This position earns leadership credit for Star (as a Scoutmaster-approved leadership project), if served successfully.

On my honor I will do my best to do my duty to:

- Regularly and enthusiastically attend, and help lead my patrol at, troop meetings and activities
- Regularly help plan and run patrol meetings and activities
- Regularly represent my patrol at Patrol Leaders' Council (PLC) meetings, including the PLC planning meeting for the term
- Help lead my patrol at Goshen (spring term only)
- Inform my patrol leader if it is necessary for me to be absent from a troop or patrol meeting or activity
- Help train other patrol-level youth leaders and assure they carry out their responsibilities
- Give each Scout a chance to do some leading in the Patrol
- Promote strong patrol spirit and identity by consistently using my patrol name, emblem, and cheer
- Make a special effort to be a good friend to each Scout in my Patrol
- Continue my own advancement and help the Scouts in my patrol advance to First Class
- Set a good example
- Proudly and correctly wear my Scout uniform and encourage the Scouts in my patrol to do the same
- Live by the Scout Oath and Law in my daily life
- Meet the troop's requirements for being considered an "active" Scout
