

Troop 1128 Leadership Agreement – Senior Patrol Leader (SPL)

To be elected to this position, a Scout must have earned the rank of Star, served successfully as a Patrol Leader and attended a pre-election SPL/PL candidate meeting. This position earns leadership credit for Life or Eagle rank, if served successfully.

On my honor I will do my best to do my duty to:

- Regularly and enthusiastically attend and run troop meetings and activities
- Plan and chair Patrol Leaders' Council (PLC) meetings, including the PLC planning meeting for the term, and during the spring term the annual program planning conference
- Lead the troop at Goshen (spring term only)
- Inform the Scoutmaster and arrange for other youth leadership if it is necessary for me to be absent from a troop meeting or activity
- Appoint other troop-level youth leaders (with the advice of the Scoutmaster) and assure they carry out their responsibilities
- Help teach youth leadership training
- Delegate responsibilities to other youth leaders
- Assure timely and clear communication of troop activities to Scouts and Scouters
- Set a good example
- Proudly and correctly wear my Scout uniform
- Live by the Scout Oath and Law in my daily life
- Meet the troop's requirements for being considered an "active" Scout
- Use the Senior Patrol Leader Handbook as a resource and pass it on to my successor (or pay for a replacement if I lose the book)
